Contribute to KLEE!

Most techniques compare with “baseline” KLEE

- But little attention is given to how these approaches combine
- I wish the gains were multiplicative!
- (see Rizzi, Elbaum, Dwyer, “On the Techniques We Create, the Tools We Build, and Their Misalignments: A Study of KLEE”, ICSE 2016)

Can we do better?

- Contribute the techniques to the KLEE mainline
 - An achievement in itself, as the barrier for successful integration is high
 - Your technique won't be forgotten
 - New techniques could compare with your technique too

Maintaining Open-source Research Projects

- (Somewhat) misaligned incentives
- Academia:
 - Encourage artifacts and artifact evolution
- Funding bodies
 - Encourage maintenance and evolution of research tools
- Industry
 - Encourage research artifacts by publicizing them, sharing your experiences
 - Support funding applications, and fund research into such projects

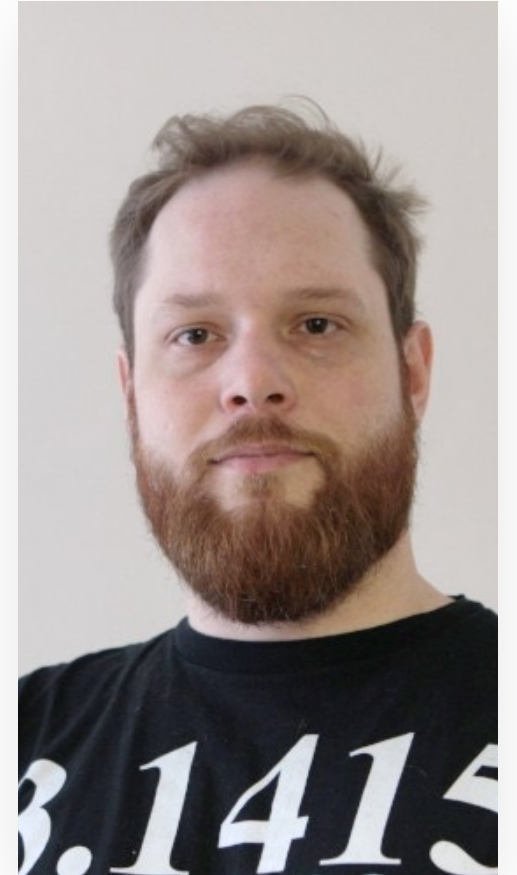
